
Pulteney is an Inclusive School –we are committed to providing a personalised educational experience for all our students.



- AMPlify aligns to the work of the future SACE




Definitions of AMPlify capabilities

Learner agency: Taking ownership of learning, being self-directed, and actively participating in the learning process.






