Most Junior School co-curricular and extra-curricular programs run from the second week of Term to the second to last week of Term.

Why Are Co-Curricular and Extra-Curricular Programs Important?

Our goal at Pulteney is to offer students practical, hands-on and meaningful experiences that enhance their skill sets, showcase their non-academic talents, and create a balanced educational experience.

Co-curricular experiences complement academic learning and contribute significantly to students' personal growth, teaching them how to live and work together. While these activities may not be part of the core curriculum, they play a crucial role in shaping students into well-rounded individuals, offering real-world, impactful experiences.

The benefits of co-curricular activities include:

- Exposure to new interests and activities
- An increased appreciation for varied experiences
- Strengthened self-confidence
- Development of specialised skills
- Fostering a sense of responsibility
- Improved academic performance
- Building stronger peer relationships

Co-curricular opportunities encompass a wide range of experiences, such as sports, music, drama, clubs, tours, events, and competitions, all of which complement our academic curriculum. These diverse offerings extend well beyond the classroom, allowing students to live out our School's values and take an active role in their learning journey.

This handbook outlines the co-curricular and extracurricular opportunities available at Pulteney, including options in sport, performing arts, and special interest areas.

2026 ACTIVITY SELECTION & ACTIVITY SCHEDULE

Nominations or expressions of interest for Pulteney's co-curricular and extra-curricular programs are managed through a program called Clipboard. This platform streamlines the process, ensuring a seamless experience for students and families.

This booklet offers an overview of the opportunities available to Pulteney Junior School students beyond the standard curriculum. Clipboard serves as a resource for families, providing detailed information about training sessions, including schedules, times, coaches, and more.

Please note that all nominations are due by **Wednesday 3 December 2025**. We encourage you to submit your nominations on time to ensure your child's participation in the desired co-curricular activities. Please contact the relevant faculty if you require assistance with nominations.

Selection confirmation

Your child's activity selections will be confirmed in February 2026 or earlier.

Nominal extra-curricular fees

A nominal fee applies to select extra-curricular activities to ensure continued high-quality instruction and enriching student experiences.

The activities and fees are as follows:

- Dance Concert: \$75 costume levy
- Da Vinci Decathlon (Years 5-11): interstate travel costs may apply

The activities and fees are as follows:

- FIRST LEGO League Challenge Program (From Year 5): interstate travel costs may apply
- The FUSE Cup International eSports Competition (From Year 5): interstate travel costs may apply
- Dance: Jazz shoes are compulsory for dance troupe students. See page 7
- Gymnastics (Year 1 & 2, Semester I or II): \$360 per semester
- Gymnastics (Years 3 & 4, Semester I): \$360 per semester
- Martial Arts (Years 3–6): \$180 per student per term
- Multisport (Years 1 & 2): \$180 per student per term
- Textiles & Enterprise: \$60 per student, per semester
- Tournament of Minds (Years 4 – 6): interstate travel costs may apply
- Yoga (Years 3–6): \$180 per student per term

These fees, structured to remain affordable, help support our commitment to providing exceptional extra-curricular opportunities for all students. Fees will be added to school fee invoices for convenience.

SPORT

Vision

Our sports program fosters essential life skills for students of all ages, preparing them for life beyond Pulteney. In the Junior School, we focus on participation and inclusion, encouraging students to enjoy the social benefits of team sports.

Reception-Year 2: Introductory, skill-based programs centered on play activities and minor games.

Years 3-6: Organised competitive activities, fostering teamwork and an appreciation for the game. Matches are played mid-week or on weekends, with practice details provided in this booklet.

Clipboard provides initial information for each sporting option available to students from Reception to Year 6 and includes information on training days, times, fixtures, and transport.

Please review the sporting options with your child and submit a nomination form (one per child) for their sport(s) selection for the entire year.

While all care is taken to provide accurate information, please be aware that changes from external organisations can occur on occasions. The sports and activities offered may differ slightly, depending on student interest.

Reception students

Activity selection for students in Reception will be sent to parents in Term 2 2026.

For Reception students, parents/caregivers can only nominate their child for one co-curricular sport and in Terms 3 and 4 only, and the invitation for parents to make their activity selection will be sent in Term 2 2026.

Year 1 & 2

There are four sport selection periods for students in Years 1 and 2, allowing them the opportunity to try a different activity each Term.

Years 3 – 6

Students in Years 3 to 6 have two selection periods for co-curricular sport:

- Summer: Term 1 and Term 4
- Winter: Term 2 & Term 3

Nomination for all sports is a commitment for 2 terms (full season). Please note, students from Year 1 to Year 4 may only nominate for one semester of Gymnastics due to limited capacity for this activity.

Students can nominate more than one sport per season or Term, as long as the activities or matches do not clash.

Sporting uniform requirements: Students must wear the new co-curricular sports uniform to comply with standards set by external sporting associations.

SPORT

Commitment

- Once a student has made a commitment to a sport, they must complete the season. Attendance at matches and practice is compulsory.
- Absence from a match or practice for unavoidable reasons (eg illness) must be communicated to the Sports Department prior to absence.
- Parents seeking permission for a student to be excused from a match must apply in writing to the Sport Department at least 48 hours prior to the match.
- Students are expected to be punctual to all practices and arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled match for appropriate warm up and team meeting.

PERFORMING ARTS

The Performing Arts at Pulteney is a platform where students can explore and develop their artistic skills through **music, dance and drama**. Students are encouraged to engage early, whether by learning an instrument, singing, or joining an ensemble, as participation fosters creativity, joy, and personal growth. Pulteney offers a variety of choirs, bands, ensembles, drama clubs, and dance groups, ensuring diversity in the program to meet students' interests.

Instrumental music tuition* is optional but highly valued, and the co-curricular program provides essential skill-building for ensemble musicianship. All co-curricular music and dance activities are provided free of charge, and students are expected to commit to their chosen groups for the entire year, with a few exceptions.

*Please note, applications for instrumental music are completed via the [Parent Portal](#).

*All Brass, woodwind and percussion instruments are available to students Years 3 and up. Children in Reception – Year 2 are offered Violin or Piano.

Admission to a group or ensemble

If admission to a group is by audition, then your child must express their interest in this group so an audition can be arranged.

Acceptance into auditioned groups is subject to a successful audition and a corresponding vacancy in the group. If your child is enrolling for a non-auditioned group, you will simply need to express interest. For these groups, enrolments are based on order of application and to a limited maximum number of students in each group.

Expectations for Performing Arts Participation

All students are expected to commit to their chosen ensembles or groups for the full year, ensuring consistent participation in rehearsals and performances. Attendance is critical for the success of both individual and group progress.

An exception to this is the Junior Year 3/4 and Junior Year 5/6 Drama Clubs, which operate per semester.

Dance Troupe Expectations

Students are required to wear their PE Uniform and Jazz Shoes in weekly Dance Troupe rehearsals. Please see details below:

Girls: Tan coloured slip-on jazz shoes
Boys: Black coloured slip-on jazz shoes

The Stage Shop, located at 50 Sir Donald Bradman Drive Mile End, keeps a record of Pulteney's dance shoe requirements. If you need to purchase shoes, please visit the shop and the staff will be happy to assist you.
