Why Are Co-Curricular and Extra-Curricular Programs Important?

Our goal at Pulteney is to offer students practical, hands-on and meaningful experiences that enhance their skill sets, showcase their non-academic talents, and create a balanced educational experience.

Co-curricular experiences complement academic learning and contribute significantly to students' personal growth, teaching them how to live and work together. While these activities may not be part of the core curriculum, they play a crucial role in shaping students into well-rounded individuals, offering real-world, impactful experiences.

The benefits of co-curricular activities include:

Co-curricular opportunities encompass a wide range of experiences, such as sports, music, drama, clubs, tours, events, and competitions, all of which complement our academic curriculum. These diverse offerings extend well beyond the classroom, allowing students to live out our School's values and take an active role in their learning journey.

Selection confirmation

Your child's activity selections will be confirmed in February 2026 or earlier.

Nominal extra-curricular fees

A nominal fee applies to select extra-curricular activities to ensure continued high-quality instruction and enriching student experiences.

The activities and fees are as follows:

- Archery (Years 7–12): \$180 per student per term
- Climbing Club (Years 8-12): \$30 per student per session
- Dance: Jazz shoes are compulsory for dance troupe students. See page 7
- Dance: Pulteney Dance Jumpers cost approx.. \$80 and are compulsory for Senior Dance Troupe students and optional for Middle School Dance Troupe students (see page 7)
- Da Vinci Decathlon (Years 5-11): interstate travel costs may apply
- FIRST LEGO League Challenge Program (Years 7-10): interstate travel costs may apply
- The FUSE Cup International eSports Competition (From Years 5-12): interstate travel costs may apply
- School Musical Production (Years 7–12):
 \$150 Costume levy
- Tournament of Minds (Years 7 − 10): interstate travel costs may apply
- Venture Club: charges vary depending on activity/experience

These fees, structured to remain affordable, help support our commitment to providing exceptional extra-curricular opportunities for all students. Fees will be added to school fee invoices for convenience.

SPORT

Vision

Our sports program is a key vehicle through which children of all ages practically learn the life skills they can carry with them long after their days at Pulteney. These skills include teamwork, organisation, overcoming adversity, success is a result of the process, working outside one's comfort zone; and the importance of mateship. School sport provides students with the ability to build a variety of relationships outside the academic classroom, increasing their support network. Our Sports Department works continuously to assist each student to understand the importance of sport and physical activity on their wellbeing.

Sporting uniform requirements: Please note, all students <u>must</u> wear the new co-curricular sports uniform to comply with standards set by external sporting associations. View the Sport Uniform Guide Years 7 - 12

Commitment

- Once a student has made a commitment to a sport, they must complete the season. Attendance at matches and practice is compulsory.
- Absence from a match or practice for unavoidable reasons (eg illness) must be communicated to the Sports Department prior to absence.
- Parents seeking permission for a student to be excused from a match must apply in writing to the Sport Department at least 48 hours prior to the match.
- Students are expected to be punctual to all practices and arrive at least 30 minutes prior to the scheduled match for appropriate warm up and team meeting.

PERFORMING ARTS

The Performing Arts at Pulteney is a platform where students can explore and develop their artistic skills through music, dance and drama. Students are encouraged to engage early, whether by learning an instrument, singing, or joining an ensemble, as participation fosters creativity, joy, and personal growth. Pulteney offers a variety of choirs, bands, ensembles, drama clubs, and dance groups, ensuring diversity in the program to meet students' interests.

Instrumental music tuition* is optional but highly valued, and the co-curricular program provides essential skill-building for ensemble musicianship. All co-curricular music and dance activities are provided free of charge, and students are expected to commit to their chosen groups for the entire year, with a few exceptions.

*Please note, applications for instrumental music are completed via the <u>Parent Portal</u>.

Admission to a group or ensemble

If admission to a group is by audition, then your child must express their interest in this group so as an audition can be arranged.

Acceptance into auditioned groups is subject to a successful audition and a corresponding vacancy in the group. If your child is enrolling for a non-auditioned group, you will simply need to express interest. For these groups, enrolments are based on order of application and to a limited maximum number of students in each group.

Expectations for Performing Arts Participation

All students are expected to commit to their chosen ensembles or groups for the full year, ensuring consistent participation in rehearsals and performances. Attendance is critical for the success of both individual and group progress.

An exception is the Middle/Senior School Musical Production, which is cast in Term 4 2025 and rehearses through Semester I 2026.

Dance Troupe Expectations

Students are required to wear their PE Uniform and Jazz Shoes in weekly Dance Troupe rehearsals. Please see details below:

Girls: Tan or Black coloured slip-on jazz shoes Boys: Black coloured slip-on jazz shoes

The Stage Shop, located at 50 Sir Donald Bradman Drive Mile End, keeps a record of Pulteney's dance shoe requirements. If you need to purchase shoes, please visit the shop and the staff will be happy to assist you.

Pulteney Dance Jumpers cost approximately \$80.00. This item is compulsory for Senior Dance Troupe students and optional for Middle School Dance Troupe students. Students will try on a sample size before orders are placed, and the cost will be charged to the student's school account in Term 1.

In 2026, dance troupes (Years 1-12) will focus on skill development and the Term 3 Dance Concert, supporting both Year 9 Dance and SACE Stage 1 and 2 Dance programs.

PERFORMING ARTS

Attendance and commitment

Regular attendance at rehearsals and performances is essential. Missing rehearsals may lead to removal from the group, and all students must participate in performances.

Students are expected to remain committed to their groups for the full year, with auditions required for some groups. Admission to auditioned groups depends on both the success of the audition and the availability of places. For non-auditioned groups, spots are filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

How to get involved

Students sign up at the start of the year and can choose their level of commitment. They can join one project, take part regularly, or help lead the group on the Student Committee. Meetings are held fortnightly during the school day, with extra opportunities to get involved throughout the year.
